





Today's first reading is an enormously important passage, not only in the history of the Jewish people, but also for us as disciples of Jesus, who see in it a foreshadowing of the Christian dispensation. The prophet announces that God has chosen to forgive the people, and that as a sign of divine forgiveness a new covenant will be established. Contrasting the new covenant with the one made with Moses on Mount Sinai, Jeremiah says that the new covenant will be written on the people's hearts rather than on tablets of stone. No longer will the community's tradition be the sole bearer of the covenant; henceforth, God will speak directly and personally to each individual, forgiving sin and calling for a return to God in faithfulness. No longer will mere outward compliance with the dictates of the Law suffice; henceforth, God asks for an obedience that springs from the depths of one's heart. Precisely that kind of obedience is highlighted in today's second reading, where the author of the Letter to the Hebrews describes Jesus as the mediator of the new covenant whose obedience has made him the source of salvation for all who, in turn, obey him.

La primera lectura de hoy es un paso muy importante, en la historia del pueblo judío y también para nosotros como discípulos de Jesús que ven en ella un anuncio de la dispensación cristiana. El profeta anuncia que Dios ha escogido perdonar al pueblo, y que como un signo del perdón divino se establecerá una nueva alianza. Contrastando la nueva alianza con la que Dios hizo con Moisés en el Monte Sinaí, Jeremías dice que el nuevo pacto será inscrito en el corazón del pueblo y no en tablas de piedra. Ya no será la tradición de la comunidad la única portadora de la alianza; a partir de ahora, Dios hablará directa y personalmente a cada individuo, perdonando el pecado y pidiendo un retorno a Él en fidelidad. Ya no bastará el mero cumplimiento de los dictados externos de la ley; a partir de ahora, Dios pide una

obediencia que brota de lo más profundo de nuestro corazón. Precisamente ese tipo de obediencia se destaca en la segunda lectura de hoy, donde el autor de la Carta a los Hebreos describe a Jesús como el mediador del nuevo pacto, cuya obediencia ha hecho de él la fuente de salvación para todos los que, a su vez, le obedecen.

Palm Sunday March 28



9:00 & 10:30 am.

Palm Sunday is the final Sunday of Lent, the beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem. Holy Mass begins with the blessing of palms in the plaza and procession into the Church.

Holy Thursday April 1



7:00 pm.

Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7:00 PM

The washing of the feet is performed on this day, represents the service and charity of Christ, who came "not to be served, but to serve". At the conclusion of the Mass, the faithful are invited to continue Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament throughout the night, just as the disciples were invited to stay up with the Lord during His agony on the Mount of Olives.

Good Friday April 2



3:00 & 7:00 pm.

On this day, we meditate on the mystery of Christ's death and we venerate the cross. Good Friday is a mandatory day of fasting and abstinence and a solemn day of prayer and mourning.

3:00 PM - The Seven Last Words of Christ on the Cross

5:00 PM - Live Stations of the Cross

7:00 PM - The Liturgy of the Passion of the Lord

The Veneration of the Cross - Adoration of The Blessed Sacrament by the tomb of Jesus.

Holy Saturday April 3

On Holy Saturday, the Church waits at the Lord's tomb in prayer, meditating on his Passion and death and on His descent into Hell, and awaiting his Resurrection.

At 8:00 PM we will celebrate **The Easter Vigil** the most glorious, beautiful and dramatic liturgy for the Church. This is also the Mass where many in RCIA are brought into full communion with the Catholic Church.



ADULT CONFIRMATION PREPARATION BEGINS APRIL 14TH

If you are a baptized practicing Catholic who has not been confirmed, you are eligible for the six week preparation classes for the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Registration currently held in the Parish Office until April 12th.

Requirements:

- 1) Must be 18+ years old
- 2) Recently issued Baptismal Certificate.
- 3) First Communion Certificate.
- 4) Classes (English): Wednesdays, 7pm—8pm

Registration in the Parish Office; Monday-Friday from 9am—5pm.

The Church strongly encourages parents to baptize their children in the first few weeks of life (Canon 867).

Requirements for 7 and under:

- ◆ Child's Birth certificate
- ◆ Parents and godparents must ATTEND a two day baptismal preparation classes (two hours each day).
- ◆ Baptismal Preparation Classes are held every month.
- ◆ Next English Class: Tuesday & Wednesday, April 13th & 14th at 7pm, in Cafeteria.
- ◆ Once the preparation is completed by both parents and godparents, parents may contact the parish office to reserve the celebration of the Baptismal liturgy.
- ◆ Children over 7 years old need to enroll in the Faith Formation Program.


